The guest speaker at the February meeting was ASHRAE President, Don Colliver, PhD, P.E., Fellow. His theme for the evening was "What/Who is ASHRAE? A President's Perspective of the Challenges and Opportunities".

He described ASHRAE as a society of 150 chapters in 120 countries worldwide, and 55,000 members dedicated to the sole purpose of advancing the arts and sciences of HVAC & R. It has an annual operating budget of \$18 million and a full

time paid staff of 105 persons. This full time staff supports the hundreds of volunteers at both the Society and Chapter levels.

ASHRAE budgets \$3 million annually for research projects which are reviewed by 190 technical committees. There are 2500 volunteer members contributing time and services to the technical committees each year.

ASHRAE coordinates activities and research with international engineering societies as well as domestic and international trade associations.

Dr. Colliver's Presidential "Theme for 2002-2003 is *"Building a Better World"*. The cornerstones of this theme are:

- ❖ **ENERGY** – Today's buildings consume 2/3 of the energy of similar buildings 20 years ago.
- ❖ **ENVIRONMENT** – Strive to improve our performance and protect our resources.
- ❖ **EDUCATION** – Strive to lead the engineering world in training our industry.
- ❖ **EMPOWERMENT** – Empower Chapters and Society to be leaders in industry and community.
- ❖ **"E" to the 4th Power – excellence in all we do.**


The captions, listing the names, are from my weakening memory and only include those whom I can remember. Many of these giants have passed from our membership, during the last thirty years, but their legacy lives on.
