Chapter History

The Golden Gavel and the Presidential Award of Excellence

For the new members and some that may not remember, chapters are graded on how well they perform in all of the committees throughout the year. You may have heard about the "PAOE award" and/or the "Golden Gavel", but few know their origins and how these awards came to be such lofty goals for a local chapter.

During the ASHRAE winter meeting in Columbus OH in 1968, William Collins of Oklahoma City; George Meffert, Past Regional Chairman of Dallas TX; and Jack Thompson, Regional Chairman of Dallas TX had several lengthy discussions concerning ways of stimulating chapter activities in Region VIII. From these discussions, evolved the Golden Gavel Award, which would be presented each year to the Region VIII chapter that excelled in chapter activities for that society year. Collins and Thompson formulated the award criteria, which has been revised as areas of interest have increased.

The winning chapter receives the award, an actual gold gavel, and this award travels around the region every year. Region VIII is the only region who has the Golden Gavel award. The gavel was purchased by Mr. Collins and on which is inscribed the ASHRAE insignia and Region VIII. In addition to the golden gavel, the president of the winning chapter receives a lapel pin, and the chapter receives an award patch for their chapter banner. The president's lapel pin, as designed by Mr. Collins, consists of a miniature gavel of gold, and is affixed to the past president's pin that he or she receives at the end of their term.

The Golden Gavel is the one award every president would like to win for his chapter in Region VIII.



At the Region VIII CRC in Houston, TX April 1970, Society President – Elect Frank Bridgers, Albuquerque, NM, was so impressed by the effects of the Golden Gavel competition among the Region VIII chapters that he conceived the idea of the "Presidential Award of Excellence", or the PAOE as it is commonly referred as today.

In January of 1971, at the Winter Society Meeting, Bridgers announced his “Award of Excellence” for the coming society year. This award has the same enthusiasm and activity among chapters throughout the society.

The Golden Gavel Committee that judges the winner each year is appointed by the Director and Regional Chairman (DRC) and consists of presidential member William Collins as honorary chair, two past DRC’s, one of whom is chair, five past presidents, an alternate DRC and an alternate past president. The judging is based on several areas of chapter activity including members attending CRC, membership promotion, research promotion, education committee promotion, chapter newsletter and roster, and member attendance at chapter meetings.

The PAOE points is a collaborative effort on behalf of all the chapter officers and committee heads. The chapter president is responsible to see that all of his chairpersons stay up to date and perform their duties to the fullest and as a result, maximize these PAOE points. Our chapter has always done very well in getting “PAR” in all of the points for each committee, that is, reaching the minimum recommended points in each area.

Our chapter is one of two chapters who has received the “Premier Presidential Award of Excellence” since it started in 1971 meaning our chapter has reached the PAR requirement every year since the award was created.

Historically, rarely has the CRC host chapter won the Golden Gavel. It would be nice if our chapter could be the first chapter to make this happen. If we could get everyone in our chapter be in attendance at the CRC and all the committees be in good standing, we might just make it happen. Plus you will have the opportunity to meet many people from other chapters and have a great time. So make your plans now to attend and see what you can do to help our chapter this year. The CRC committee is working very hard to make sure we have another great CRC in Tulsa for 2012.


